College & Career

Seniors, all signs point to the FAFSA*!

GRANTS. If your family qualifies for free/reduced lunch or is close to those qualifications, a Pell Grant (free money from the federal government, up to ~\$6500/year) could be waiting for you!

Depending on your college and financial situation, state-based and/or college-based grants might be available to you too, even for families whose income levels are much, much higher than free/reduced lunch requirements.

SCHOLARSHIPS. Besides being used for financial-based aid, some colleges require the FAFSA on file (regardless of your ability to pay) to be eligible for scholarships based on YOUR academics, leadership, and/or service (hello CU Boulder!). Plus, some scholarships consider financial need and use the FAFSA to determine that.

LOANS. The interest rate on a federal student loan is fixed and is typically lower than private loan rates. No credit check or cosigner is required to qualify for most federal student loans. Repayment doesn't begin until after you've left college or dropped below half-time enrollment. Remember, just because you are offered loans doesn't mean you have to use them.



FAFSA. Complete the FAFSA at fafsa.gov. You will need tax information from 2021 for you and your parent(s)/household. Find more [details here](#).

Once you are finished with the FAFSA, check your college(s) portal to see if they require additional information (sometimes this means potential for extra money!!). Look for financial aid packages to post on your portal after you have been admitted. The timeline can

vary, but it is common to see financial aid offers start showing up in February and March. Remember, this is part of why you don't need to commit anywhere until May—you need that time to make an informed decision. Nearly all students who complete the FAFSA get some form of financial aid. In fact, 80% of CSU students receive financial aid. Get it done!

*FAFSA is only available to US Citizens and [eligible non-citizens](#). Students who are not eligible for the FAFSA should complete the [CAFSA](#) for Colorado aid (to be used at a Colorado college)



Attendance Protocols

Call in method:

1. Give student's full name.
2. Student's ID number (this is essential as we have over 2000 students).
3. Parent or guardian's name.
4. Date of absences and periods.
5. The reason for the absence.

We will mark your student absent if a reason is NOT given.

ParentVUE method:
