Be sure your final transcript gets sent to your college choice—simply complete your senior surveys fully and accurately before check out. If you have earned credit through CSU, CU, or FRCC, be sure to send that college transcript to the college you will be attending. If you plan on competing in Division I or Division II college sports, check with Leah to ensure that your final transcript is sent to the NCAA Initial Eligibility Clearinghouse.
