## School Profile 2023-2024

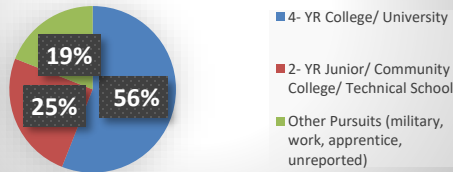
**Rocky Mountain High School (RMHS)** is a comprehensive four-year public high school (grades 9-12) located in Fort Collins, Colorado. Fort Collins has a population of around 167,000 and is home to Colorado State University and many tech industries. RMHS is part of Poudre School District (PSD), which is comprised of 32 elementary schools, 12 middle schools, 10 high schools, 6 charter schools, and 1 online school. The total enrollment for PSD is 30,105 with a professional staff of 2,323.

Rocky is on a 4 quarter, 4 class block schedule. Each 9-week quarter block meets daily for 90 minutes and is 5 credits. Variable credits are earned in PaCE, enrichment experiences, and some music classes. The average class size is 32 in academic classes.

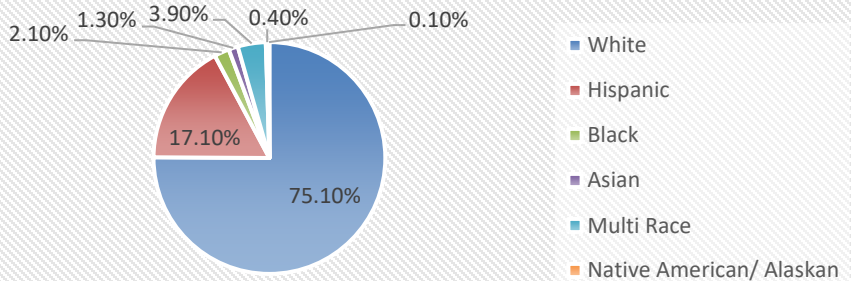

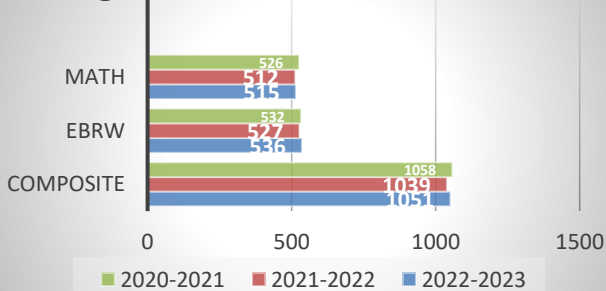
### Class of 2023 81% of Graduates Attending Higher Education

## REPEAT FORGIVEN

When a student retakes a class, the highest grade earned for that class is factored into the student's GPA. If there is an **R** next to the class on the transcript, it denotes repeat forgiven and that grade is not factored into the GPA.

## GPA

Unweighted Cumulative	Students GPAs are calculated on the 4-point scale regardless of whether or not the course is an AP or post-secondary course.
Adjusted	Students earn GPA bonus points of .002 for each credit earned in AP and post-secondary courses in which students receive an A, B, or C grade.
Weighted Cumulative	Students earn GPA bonus points of 1.0 for each credit earned in AP and post-secondary courses in which students receive an A, B, or C grade. The GPA is weighted on a 4.0 scale.

## CLASS RANK

Class rank is calculated based on a student's adjusted GPA.  
 Top 10% GPA = 4.089 - 4.36  
 Top 20% GPA = 3.47 - 4.36  
 Top 50% GPA = 3.371 - 4.36

**Spring Semester 2020 Grade Explanation:**

**Semester long classes:**

1. Student receives the higher grade (3Q or 4Q) as their final grade for 4th quarter.
2. Student that failed quarter 3:
  - a. Student receives the grade they earned for 4Q if they earned a D or better.
  - b. Students that have shown even minimal effort but have not earned at least a D will receive an S as their final grade.

**Quarter long classes:**

1. Students receive the grade they earned if D or better.
2. Students that have shown even minimal effort but have not earned at least a D will receive an S as their final grade.
